# **Nursery Bonnets**

As a Community Outreach Project we are knitting or crocheting caps for the infants at our local hospitals. Infants loose a large percentage of body heat through their heads. The hats help keep them warm. The following two patterns, one for knitters and one for crocheters, will help you to join us in this venture. The hospital staff joins us in thanking you for your help.

# **Knitting Directions**

### **Materials**

Baby weight orlon or acrilic Double pointed or round needles, size 4

#### Method

Cast on 72 stitches (24 sts on each of 3 needles) Knit (ribbing): K2, P2 for  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches Continue knitting (stockinette stitch) for 6 inches to a total length of  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches for a complete cap Bind off

One inch from the top, wrap a length of yarn tightly around the cap to form a tassel

## Crochet Directions

### *Materials*

Baby weight orlon or acrilic Crochet hook #4 or size E

#### Method

Ch 41, turn

Skip first ch, sc in next 30 stitches, sl st in last 10 stitches, ch 1 and turn Sl st in next 10 stitches, sc in the next 30 stitches, ch 1 and turn Repeat these 2 rows until 44 rows are completed Sew a **flat** seam to make a tube.

Tie a piece of yarn around the slip stitches to form the top of the hat

### Variation

The hat can be done in double crochet instead of single crochet
